Visitor Attractions

Forfar Loch Country Park

The Meffan

Right in Forfar's historic town centre is The Meffan built in 1898 as a bequest from the daughter of Provost Meffan. Originally Forfar's library and museum, the building is now a lively art gallery and museum. The museum presents The Forfar Story from its Pictish roots, to the dark witch hunts of the 17th Century.

War Memorial

Balmashanner Hill
War memorials vary in their scale and design, but few have the presence of the tower on Balmashanner Hill. The high vantage point affords extensive views over the Vale of Strathmore to the west and the Braes and Angus to the north.

Restenneth Priory

Found on the B9113 Forfar to Montrose Road 1.25 miles out of Forfar. Historic Scotland. Tel: 0131 668 8600.
A house of Augustinian Canons, probably founded by King David on the site of a previous church, which may date back to Pictish times.

The Battle of Dunnichen

Dunnichen, by Forfar.
At the road junction in Dunnichen hamlet, just outside Forfar, a replica of the original Pictish stone commemorates the battle of Dunnichen (also known as Nechtansmere) in 685 AD, when the Picts defeated the Northumbrian army.

Glamis Castle

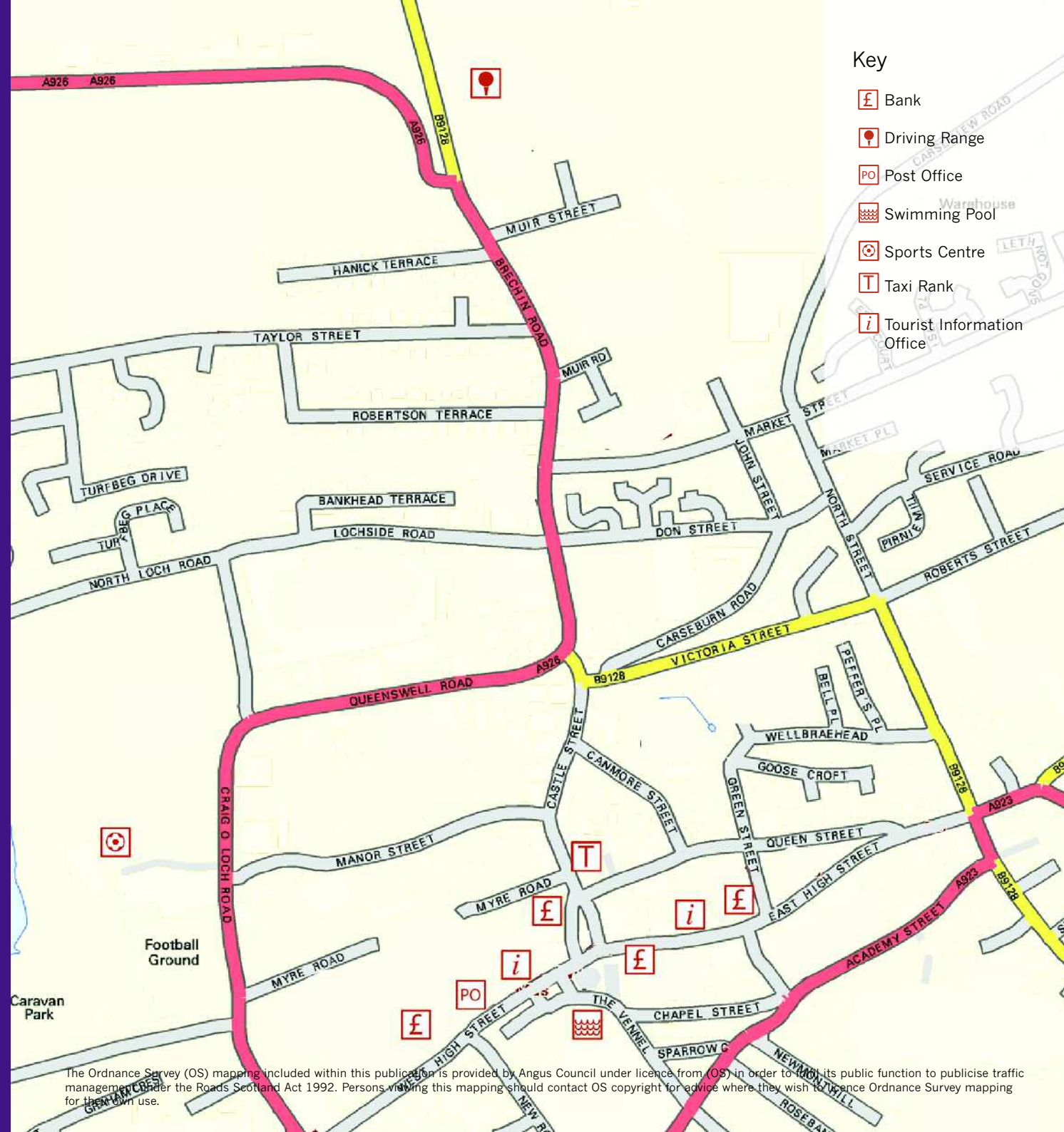

The county town of Forfar lies at the heart of Angus overlooking the scenic Vale of Strathmore. A favourite royal residence in the 12th and 13th centuries and an important religious centre, Forfar has an intriguing past. It is believed that King Malcolm Canmore held “parliament” in Forfar and conferred surnames and titles to the Scottish nobility. Certainly there was a royal residence here, terraces of which can be found just north of the town centre at Castle Hill, today marked by the former market cross. The town earned for itself quite a notorious reputation in the 17th Century, due to the number of women burned here for witchcraft. These executions took place on the tract of land just north of the town, which even to this day is known as the “The Witches Hollow”. Today, the splendid local produce and local specialities are sure to tempt you to the table after a busy day exploring. One local meal you cannot leave the town without feasting on is the famous Forfar bridie, the local equivalent of the Cornish pasty, said to take its name from the late Mrs Bridie. It was eaten by farm workers, with the casing of the pastry allowing the bridie to be eaten out of work-soiled hands and the crust was simply thrown away.
