Visitor Attractions

Airlie Monument

A memorial for the 10th Earl of Airlie, the Airlie Monument lies high on Tulloch Hill (387m/1269 feet) between the ends of Glen Prosen and Glen Clova, 5 miles (8 km) north of Kirriemuir.

Angus Folk Museum

Kirkwynd, Glamis. T: 01307 840 288. Mon-Sat, 11am-5pm. Sun 1pm-5pm. Adults £5, family £14, 1 parent £10, concession £4, car park £2. Located in the conservation village of Glamis, the Angus Folk Museum illustrates the daily life of the ordinary people of rural communities in Angus in the 18th and 19th centuries. The steading houses Life on the Land - tools, machinery, and interesting bits and pieces from bygone farmyards, as well as the Glen Isla Hearse - a horse-drawn hearse used in the Glen for many a year.

Barrie's Birthplace

9 Brechin Road. T: 01575 572 646. Mon-Sat 11am-5pm, Sun 1pm-5pm. Adults £5, family £14, 1 Parent £10, concession £4. Birthplace in 1860 of the playwright JM Barrie, creator of Peter Pan.

Camera Obscura

Kirrie Hill. T: 01575 572 646 Mon-Sat, 12 noon-5pm, Sun 1pm-5pm. Adult £5, family £14, 1 parent £10 concession £4. The Camera Obscura lies on Kirrie Hill, overlooking Kirriemuir and Strathmore. Both the camera, and the cricket pavilion in which it sits, were donated in 1930 by JM Barrie to his home town.

Kirriemuir Aviation Museum

Bellies Brae. T: 01575 573 233. Mon-Thur 10am-5pm, Fri-Sun 11am-5pm. Located close to the centre of Kirriemuir, the Kirriemuir Aviation Museum was established in 1987 and concerns itself principally with British military aviation. It offers visitors access to a remarkable collection of artefacts which trace the history of the Royal Air Force.

Kirriemuir Gateway to the Glens Museum

The Town House, 32 High Street. T: 01575 575479 Mon-Sat, 1pm-5pm. Closed Sunday. Located in the former Kirriemuir Town House, the Gateway to the Glens Museum describes the culture, environment and history of Kirriemuir and the western Angus Glens: Glen Prosen, Glenisla, Glen Clova and Glen Doll. It also has displays on famous sons and daughters of the town, including authors JM Barrie and Violet Jacob and rock singer Bon Scott of AC/DC.

On the southern slopes of the Grampian hills nestles Kirriemuir, the gateway to the magnificent Glens and a burgh which has retained much of its charm.

The story of the Wee Red Town, as Kirriemuir is known, is revealed in the Gateway to the Glens Museum.

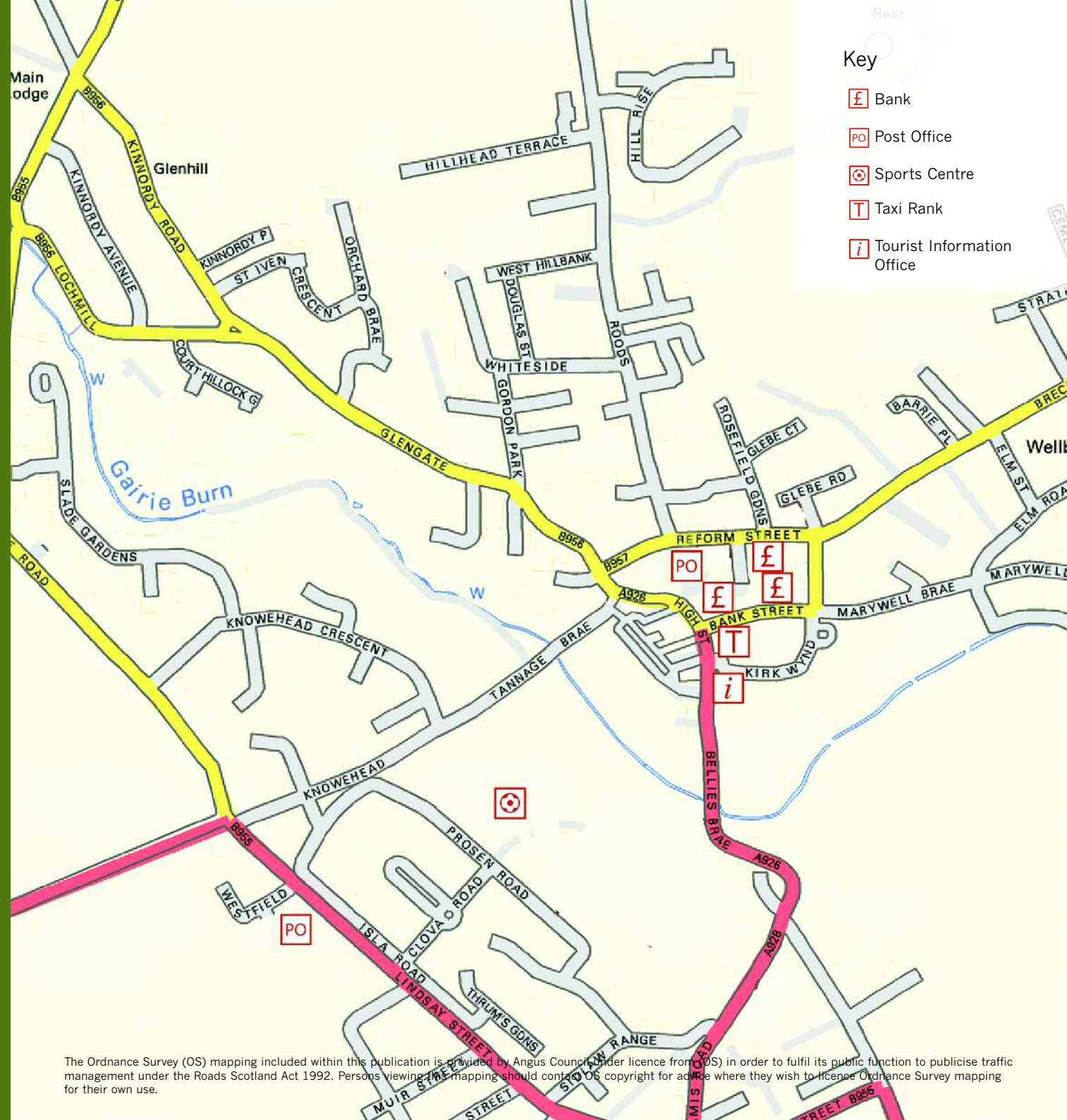
Packed with fascinating artifacts and eye-catching displays, the museum takes the visitor on a tour of the burgh and the beautiful glens beyond.

This fairy-tale town is perhaps best-known as the birthplace in 1860 of J M Barrie, the creator of Peter Pan whose childhood home has been carefully restored as a museum.

Other visitor attractions include a variety of craft workshops and one of Scotland's three cameras obscura, which offers panoramic views of the surrounding countryside.






Lying outside Kirriemuir is the historic village of Glamis, with its traditional thatched roofed cottages, famous castle and Angus Folk Museum.
